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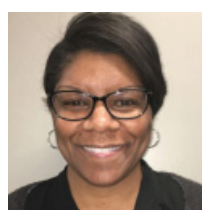
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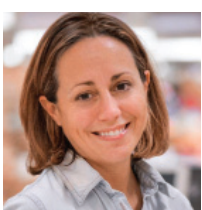
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Community Spotlight Agencies

Legal Clinic for the Disabled, Inc. (Southeast PA)

Founded in 1987, the mission of the Legal Clinic for the Disabled, Inc. (LCD) is to empower low-income people with disabilities and the deaf and hard of hearing in the Philadelphia region to achieve inclusion, independence, and justice by providing free, quality legal representation to overcome legal obstacles that would otherwise affect their independence, health, or quality of life.

LCD's primary activity is providing no-cost legal advice and extended legal representation to its clients, who have incomes at or below 200% of the federal poverty level. On any given day, you can find one of their paralegals arranging client transportation to court or an attorney advocating on behalf of a client living in substandard housing conditions or facing eviction. LCD's team possesses an unmatched passion for the rights of low-income people with disabilities to live with dignity and respect in their communities.

PA Link to Aging and Disability is a program that assists seniors and individuals with disabilities. PA Link is part of the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) and is available throughout the state. PA Link's Mission is to improve access to long term services and supports that is accomplished through integrated network of partner agencies committed to expanding the use of community-based solutions. PA Link promotes Person-Centered decision making and enhancement of quality services. Penn Asian Senior Services (PASSi)
