Policy/Criteria

Provider must submit documentation (such as office chart notes, lab results or other clinical information) supporting that member has met all approval criteria.

It is the policy of health plans affiliated with PA Health and Wellness[®] that Self-Injected Epinephrine is **medically necessary** when the following criteria are met:

I. Requirements for Prior Authorization of Epinephrine, Self-Injected

A. <u>Prescriptions That Require Prior Authorization</u>

All prescriptions for Epinephrine, Self-Injected designated as non-preferred will require prior authorization.

B. Clinical Review Guidelines and Review of Documentation for Medical Necessity

In evaluating a request for prior authorization of a prescription for a non-preferred Epinephrine, Self-Injected, the determination of whether the requested prescription is medically necessary will take into account whether the recipient:

1. Has a documented history of therapeutic failure, intolerance, or contraindication of the preferred Epinephrine, Self-Injected

OR

2. Does not meet the clinical review guidelines listed above, but, in the professional judgment of the physician reviewer, the services are medically necessary to meet the medical needs of the recipient

C. Clinical Review Process

Prior authorization personnel will review the request for prior authorization and apply the clinical guidelines in Section B. above, to assess the medical necessity of the request for a prescription for an Epinephrine, Self-Injected. If the guidelines in Section B are met, the reviewer will prior authorize the prescription. If the guidelines are not met, the prior authorization request will be referred to a physician reviewer for a medical necessity determination. Such a request for prior authorization will be approved when, in the professional judgment of the physician reviewer, the services are medically necessary to meet the medical needs of the recipient.



D. <u>Approval Dose/Duration</u>: 2 epinephrine injectors/syringes per 30 days
